



This café provides a safe space for young people to socialise and have fun while also giving them access to youth workers who can listen to any issues they may have and support them. We provide snacks and drinks, prepared by our young leaders in the kitchen.





This term, we have made the most of celebrations like Valentine's Day and Pancake Day, providing themed activities and food. On Mondays, we have been looking at self-esteem and how we can nurture a healthy attitude towards ourselves. We have also been looking at the life and actions of Jesus, learning about his character. We are looking

forward to the improving weather and spending more time outdoors.

LYP is continuing to have input in the Howard of Effingham school, running lunchtime clubs such as a Christian Union alongside Bookham Baptist Church. We have also been able to offer 1:1 meetings to support young people and we are so grateful for this opportunity to contribute to the wellbeing of local students.

In the Easter holidays, we will be taking 30 young people from Leatherhead and Bookham on a three-day residential called Freestyle.

Before Christmas some 250 shoeboxes, collected from our parish and the neighbouring schools of St Teresa's and Cranmore, left our parish as part of "Love in a Box" Christmas Shoebox Appeal organised by Children in Distress. The shoeboxes are sent to orphanages in Romania, filled with little things to keep the recipients, whether young or old, warm, clean and entertained.

With the help of two generous donations, a Cake and Jam Sale held in mid February, raised £1,050 in aid of the Mtanditka Trade School (St Agnes Vocational Training College) in Tanzania. The college trains some 50 students in electrical engineering, tailoring and hotel management.

Catholic Parish News

Fr Charles has been with us for over a year now and the restructuring of the diocese of Arundel and Brighton under the stewardship of Bishop Richard Moth has very slowly begun. The new Epsom deanery parish includes our parish of Effingham and Fetcham and that of Tadworth, Ewell, Epsom, Ashtead, Cobham, Leatherhead, Dorking and Banstead. The reasoning behind this is so that, with vocations to the priesthood falling, resources can be shared and the clergy supported. The moderator of our new deanery parish is Fr Chris Bergin from St Michael's, Ashtead. He will be helped by a Parish Leadership Team — a mix of clergy and lay people from the nine parishes. In the first of his termly newsletters Fr Chris features two of the clergy and also prescribes swapping of pulpits at weekend masses for both priests and deacons in which we can get to know each other.




In the second newsletter just received, our Deacon lan Wells features. He describes how his family first lived in Portsmouth and how he was a daily altar server for the dockers. He met Jean, his wife, while living in Brighton. He climbed the corporate ladder with an oil company requiring many moves until finally settling in Bookham. He was ordained in 2008 and in 2010 had the additional role for ten years as RC chaplain at Gatwick Airport, a time he describes as dynamic and rewarding. He is now a member of the Bishop's Council of Deacons and part of the mentoring team to assist the clergy. The article finishes with his words "I praise God for this special Ministry, my marriage and my family."

In January we were sorry to lose Martin Hollins, a valued member of Holy Spirit church and Churches Together in Bookham. His Requiem Mass at Worth Abbey was a fitting tribute and a wonderful celebration of his life.
