## Our Achievements:

We are proud to have received a Bronze Eco Church Award for working with the St Nicolas church family to express our care for God's world. This has inspired us to strive towards higher awards.



## Our Recycling Initiatives:

At present we collect:

- ✔ Spectacles - passed to local opticians for reuse eg in schemes like Mission for Vision
- ✔ Plastic milk bottle tops - sent for reprocessing with a donation to A Rocha conservation charity
- ✔ Used postage stamps - distributed between five charities to raise funds for them
- ✔ Binoculars - passed to the RSPB for use by conservation groups in Third World countries
- ✔ Postcards - collected for Mission Aviation Fellowship
- ✔ Plastic mailing wrappers – these are returned to Polyprint in Norfolk for reprocessing
- ✔ Mobile phones and certain used printer cartridges - recycled to benefit Traidcraft Exchange
- ✔ Foreign/UK notes and coins (even if no longer legal tender) - for Guildford Cathedral's appeal
- ✔ Old writing instruments (pens/felt pens etc) – passed to Bookham Library for their Terracycle collection.

## Fair Trade:



We are committed to using Fair Trade products whenever we serve refreshments and encourage other church room users to do likewise. A Fair Trade stall is held on the second Sunday of each month in church.

## Get Involved:

- ✔ Audit your own wastefulness – don't buy what you don't need!
- ✔ Use your LOAF – buy local, organic, animal-friendly and fairly traded goods.
- ✔ Use eco-friendly cleaning products – Ecover and/or supermarket eco products.
- ✔ Compost kitchen waste; go organic.
- ✔ Use water wisely; take showers, use water butts for garden watering/car cleaning
- ✔ Use energy saving lightbulbs; turn off lights when leaving a room; do not leave electrical appliances on standby.
- ✔ Turn down the central heating thermostat; change to your energy supplier's Green Tariff.
- ✔ Re-use shopping bags. Use recycled paper and products made from renewable and sustainable resources.
- ✔ Invest ethically. Surrey Credit Union offers loans and investment opportunities
- ✔ Reduce car use: lift share; join a car pool.
- ✔ Use public transport, walk, cycle.
- ✔ Encourage wildlife in gardens – ponds, bird feeders, bug houses, re-wilding
- ✔ Reduce air miles; use carbon offset schemes.
- ✔ Educate children and each other – Transition Bookham - working towards Bookham becoming more planet friendly [www.transitionbookham.org.uk](http://www.transitionbookham.org.uk)
